

Prof Ross Robinson

Professor Robinson is Professor and Executive Director of the Australian Centre for Integrated Freight Systems Management in the School of Enterprise at the University of Melbourne, Melbourne, Australia.

He previously held the Foundation Chair in Transport Systems (Intermodal Transport) at Victoria University, Melbourne; and was, earlier, Director of the Centre for Maritime and Intermodal Systems at the Macquarie Graduate School of Management in Sydney. Over the period 1996 to 1997 Professor Robinson directed the Maritime Program in the Institute of Transport Studies at the Graduate School of Business in the University of Sydney; and from 1986 to 1995 he was Director of the Centre for Transport Policy Analysis at the University of Wollongong.

Professor Robinson was a member of the first Port Research team in UNCTAD (the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development) in Geneva and later directed the Port Development Program for the United Nations ESCAP (the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific) in Bangkok over most of the period between 1975 and 1980. He has carried out major projects for the Australian State and Federal governments and agencies, for the World Bank, for the NSW Coal Association and the Australian Mining Industries Council, for port authorities and shipping companies and for the Royal Commission into Grain Handling and Storage. He has extensive experience in Southeast and East Asia.
